Smile (Smile # 1) by Raina Telgemeier - "Raina just wants to be a normal sixth grader. But one night after Girl Scouts she trips and falls, severely injuring her two front teeth, and what follows is a long and frustrating journey with on-again, off-again braces, surgery, embarrassing headgear, and even a retainer with fake teeth attached. And on top of all that, there is still more to deal with: a major earthquake, boy confusion, and friends who turn out to be not so friendly. This coming-of-age true story is sure to resonate with anyone who has ever been in middle school, and especially those who have ever had a bit of their own dental drama."

A Good Kind of Trouble - "Twelve-year-old Shayla is allergic to trouble. All she wants to do is to follow the rules. (Oh, and she would also like to make it through seventh grade with her best friendships intact, learn to run track, and have a cute boy see past her giant forehead.) But in junior high, it is like all the rules have changed. Now she is suddenly questioning who her best friends are and some people at school are saying she's not black enough. Wait, what?

Tristan Strong Punches a Hole in the Sky (Tristan Strong, 1) - Sent to Alabama to recover from an accident that killed his best friend, 7th grader Tristan Strong hasn't felt very strong in a long time. On his first night in Alabama, a creature comes into his bedroom and steals his lost friend's journal, and Tristan has no choice but to follow. In the chaos that ensues, Tristan punches a tree, inadvertently opening a chasm into the Midpass, a land of burning ships and volatile creatures hunting the people of our world. In Midpass, Tristan finds himself in the center of a battle that has worn down its warriors, Black folk heroes John Henry and Brer Rabbit. To close the opening to Midpass, Tristan and his new allies will have to seek out Anansi the Weaver and find a way to barter with the trickster that will not mean Tristan losing everything else he loves.

"One Crazy Summer by Rita Williams- Garcia – One Crazy Summer is a children's novel of historical fiction by Rita Williams-Garcia. Set during the summer of 1968 in Oakland, California, "One Crazy Summer" follows the lives of the Gaither sisters, Delphine, Vonetta, and Fern, as they visit with their mother who abandoned them some seven years before.

New Kid by Jerry Craft - "Seventh grader Jordan Banks loves nothing more than drawing cartoons about his life. But instead of sending him to the art school of his dreams, his parents enroll him in a prestigious private school known for its academics, where Jordan is one of the few kids of color in his entire grade.

Class Act by Jerry Craft - "A moving and often very funny story about the convergence of an awkward age (13 to 14) with an awkward age (America's racial reckoning).... [Craft] balances his biting sendup of American race relations with poignant family portraits, and the art is most striking in quiet moments."

The Offenders by Jerry Craft - Bullies beware! A freak accident gives five middle school bullies super powers. But instead of being able to transform into cool super-beings, they take on the characteristics of the kids they bully. Sure their abilities may be at an all-time high, but do they really have what it takes to save their school when their self-esteem is at an all-time low? "The Offenders is the best use of detention since The Breakfast Club funny, exciting, and the most charming thing I've read in ages. Writing something entertaining is tough, but writing something important is even tougher. Jerry and his boys have made it look easy.

Loot by Jude Watson – On a foggy night in Amsterdam, man falls from a rooftop to the wet pavement below. It's Alfie McQuinn the notorious cat burglar, and he's dying. As sirens wail in the distance, Alfie manages to get out two last words to his young son, March "Find Jewels"

Sting by Jude Watson - March and Jules are teenage twins, following in their father's footsteps as jewel thieves, but when their latest job goes wrong they end up with one jewel, a sapphire called the Morning Star, one of three cursed jewels--and the only way they can break the curse is to elude the FBI

<u>Ghost Boys</u> by Jewell Parker Rhodes - Twelve-year-old Jerome is shot by a police officer who mistakes his toy gun for a real one. Now a ghost, Jerome watches the devastation unleashed on his family and community in the wake of what they see as an unjust and brutal killing. Soon, Jerome meets another ghost: Emmett Till, a boy from a very different time but similar circumstances.

The Stars Beneath Our Feet by David Moore - It's Christmas Eve in Harlem, but twelve-year-old Lolly Rachpaul and his mom aren't celebrating. They're still reeling from his older brother's death in a gang-related shooting just a few months earlier. Then Lolly's mother's girlfriend brings him a gift that will change everything: two enormous bags filled with Legos. Lolly's always loved Legos, and he prides himself on following the kit instructions exactly. Now, faced with a pile of building blocks and no instructions, Lolly must find his own way forward.

The Boy in the Striped Pajamas by John Boyn- During World War II, 8-year-old Bruno (Asa Butterfield) and his family leave Berlin to take up residence near the concentration camp where his father (David Thewlis) has just become commandant. Unhappy and lonely, he wanders out behind his house one day and finds Shmuel (Jack Scanlon), a Jewish boy of his age. Though the barbed-wire fence of the camp separates them, the boys begin a forbidden friendship, oblivious to the real nature of their surroundings.

Their Eyes Were Watching God by Zora Neal Hurston - Their Eyes Were Watching God follows the life of Janie Crawford, a girl of mixed black and white heritage, around the turn of the century...which was not an easy time to be of mixed race. As an adolescent, Janie sees a bee pollinating a flower in her backyard pear tree and becomes obsessed with finding true love.

Piecing Me Together by Renee Watson - The recipient of multiple awards and one of our favorite middle school books, this novel is a powerful story about a girl striving for success in a world that too often seems like it's trying to break her

<u>The Skin I'm in</u> by Sharon G. Flake - Maleeka suffers every day from the taunts of the other kids in her class—about her homemade clothes, her good grades, or her dark, black skin. A new teacher starts at their school. Her face is blotched with a startling white patch, but she loves her skin. Can Maleeka learn to do the same?

The Night Diary by Veera Hiranandan - Nisha watches her home country of India divide into India and Pakistan in 1947, and suddenly, Muslims and Hindus are being killed crossing the new border. Nisha's family decides they, too, must cross, and she fears for her life during the long journey.

Buddha Boy by: *Kathe Koja* - (Farrar, Straus and Giroux, 2003) *128 pages*. In this young adult novel, Jinsen is bullied because of his dragon T-shirts, shaved head, and his religious lifestyle. Justin becomes his partner in a class project and starts to see Jinsen differently. Standing up for Jinsen complicates Justin's life and his position in the social hierarchy of high school

Clap when you Land – by Elizabeth Acevedo -Camino Rios lives in the Dominican Republic. Yahaira Rio lives in New York City. They don't know about each other, or even know they have a sister, until their beloved Papi unexpectedly dies in an airplane crash, flying from New York to the Dominican Republic to visit Camino. As both grieve, they learn about each other and unravel the web of secrets their family kept from them. Told in dual perspectives, through the beautiful verse of each girl's poetry, the Rios sisters try to figure out how to keep pursuing their dreams even when tragedy strikes.

The Hate you Give by Angie Thomas - Sixteen-year-old Starr Carter moves between two worlds: the poor neighborhood where she lives and the fancy suburban prep school she attends. The uneasy balance between these worlds is shattered when Starr witnesses the fatal shooting of her childhood best friend Khalil at the hands of a police officer.

Concrete Rose by Angie Thomas - Concrete Rose is the prequel to The Hate You Give, following Maverick Carter's life as he becomes a teen father. He must decide between staying in the gang his father was a part of or changing everything and getting out for his new son.

This is my America by Kim Johnson - The Hate U Give meets Just Mercy in this unflinching yet uplifting first novel that **explores the racist injustices in the American justice system**. Every week, seventeen-year-old Tracy Beaumont writes letters to Innocence X, asking the organization to help her father, an innocent Black man on death row.

The Girl with the Louding Voice - The unforgettable, inspiring story of a teenage girl growing up in a rural Nigerian village who longs to get an education so that she can find her "louding voice" and speak up for herself, The Girl with the Louding Voice is a simultaneously heartbreaking and triumphant tale about the power of fighting for your dreams

St. Andrew Catholic Home and School Association

The St. Andrew Catholic Home and School Association is an organization comprised of all parents and guardians of St. Andrew Catholic School students. Their purpose is to promote open communication, goodwill and cooperation among the parents, teachers, and administration by providing an opportunity for parents and teachers to work together for the good of the children. HSA also directs and coordinates parental education and supports St. Andrew Catholic School through assistance activities, social functions and fundraisers.

Membership is open to all parents and guardians of students of St. Andrew Catholic School and the faculty of the school. A voting member shall consist of the entire family unit and the member must be in good financial standing with the association to cast a vote.

We are in the process of looking for the following officers for the 2023-2024 school year:

President

- a. The president shall be the chief executive officer of the association. He/she shall have authority over the general and active management of the business and affairs of the association, subject to the direction of the board.
- b. The president shall call and preside over all regular and special meetings of the association and executive board.

Vice President

- a. Acts as an aide to the President
- b. Performs the duties and exercise the powers of the President in the absence of the President
- c. Performs such duties as assigned by the Home and School Association Board of Directors

Secretary

- a. The secretary shall be responsible for keeping a true and accurate record of meetings of this association and of the executive board.
- b. The secretary shall be responsible for keeping a current and accurate listing of members.
- c. The secretary shall be responsible for notifying all board members of regular or special meetings of the board. He/she shall be responsible for sending notification of regular or special meetings of the association to all members.
- d. He/she shall handle such correspondence as the president or executive board shall direct.

Treasurer

- a. Works with the President to create an annual budget for the Home and School Association
- b. Presents the budget to the Home and School Association Board for approval
- c. Keeps an accurate record of receipts and expenditures

Homeroom Parent (HR) Coordinator

- a. Update and prepare HR Parent notebook for distribution annually to new HR Parents and assist with the HR Parent meeting at the beginning of the school year.
- b. Assist or serve as Chairperson of the Teacher Appreciation Committee and assists with disseminating HSA and other information via HR Parents.

Thank you for your interest in becoming a diocesan employee and/or volunteer! Please note the Safe Environment Certification process consists of 2 Steps:

Step 1: Safe Environment video and quiz

Step 2: Fingerprinting

Begin by visiting https://www.orlandodiocese.org/safe-environment/english/. Please read the instructions carefully. You cannot submit fingerprints until you have completed the Safe Environment video and passed the quiz.

Step 1: Safe Environment Video and Quiz

- 1. Watch the Safe Environment Certification video. The video is about 25 minutes long.
- When the video is complete, read the Diocesan Standards of Conduct and agree to terms. Proceed to quiz.
- Enter the Entity Code provided by your parish/school office: 259
 Choose your role/applicant type: volunteer, employee, vendor, clergy, or deacon.
 Click "next" to take the 20 question quiz.
- 4. Passing scores are 80% and above.

If you pass, you may immediately download your certificate. Results will also be emailed to your diocesan entity and to the office of Human Resources. Once the Safe Environment Certification quiz is complete, a Fieldprint code will appear specific to your entity. Please copy or write down this Fieldprint code as you will need to enter it in the next step. If you fail the quiz, you will be directed to Step 1.

Step 2: Fingerprinting

Visit www.fieldprintflorida.com to register for your fingerprinting appointment. You will need an email address for this part of the process. If you do not have an email address, please contact the Safe Environment Coordinator in your diocesan entity (parish/school office) for assistance.

Please enter the Fieldprint Code on the "Reason for Fingerprinting" screen when prompted. Then complete Fieldprint registration and schedule your appointment.

Dear St. Andrew School Parents,

Faith Formation including sacramental preparation for First Communion and Confirmation will begin on August 20. We are preparing children in Catholic School in third grade or above for First Communion provided they have at least two continuous years in Catholic School, that is, for a child in 3rd grade, they must have been in Catholic School in 1st and 2nd grades. Preparation includes attending faith formation on Sundays for one year and in April and May preparing for First Reconciliation and First Communion on Wednesdays (in addition to Sundays). In addition, the child must attend Sunday Mass during the year of preparation. Your child must be baptized in the Catholic Church and a copy of their baptism certificate must accompany the registration form unless they were baptized at St. Andrew Church.

We are also preparing our youth to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Preparation for Confirmation begins in 8th grade, it is a two-year process and the youth must have been in Catholic School or Faith Formation for the last three consecutive years, that is, 5th, 6th, and 7th grade. The first year requires attendance at Sunday faith formation sessions and Sunday Mass. If your child was baptized and received their First Communion and they want to receive their Confirmation, please complete a 2023-24 Faith Formation registration form. A copy of their Baptism and First Reconciliation certificates must accompany their registration form unless they received their First Communion at St. Andrew.

Registration forms will be on our webpage (www.standrew-orlando.org) in English, Spanish, and Creole/French in early August. All parents having children prepare for a sacrament must meet with Kathy Morgan for Confirmation, or with me for First Communion. Once we receive your registration, we will call to schedule a meeting.

La preparación para la Confirmación comienza en 8° grado, es un proceso de dos años y el joven debe haber estado en Escuela Católica o Formación de Fe consecutivamente durante los últimos tres años, es decir, 5°, 6° y 7° grado. El primer año requiere asistir a las sesiones de Formación de Fe los domingos y a la Misa. Si su hijo fue bautizado y recibió su Primera Comunión y quiere recibir su Confirmación, complete un formulario de registro de Formación en la Fe 2023-24. Una copia de sus certificados de Bautismo y Primera Comunión deben acompañar su formulario de registro a menos que hayan recibido su Primera Comunión en San Andrés.
